OSHA ISSUES NEW SILICA RULES

Learn about the new regulations and its potential impact on your business and your client's businesses.

On March 24, 2016, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) issued its final regulation to limit worker exposure to crystalline silica, amending a standard that has been in place since 1971. A business performing work that generates dust, could be subject to this regulation.

The new regulation requires employers to:

- Evaluate employee exposure to silica
- Develop an exposure control plan if the AL is exceeded
- Implement engineering controls (such as water or ventilation) to limit worker exposure
- Provide respirators when engineering controls are infeasible
- Provide medical surveillance to employees
- Implement strict housekeeping standards.
