THE FUTURE OF LED

Presentation Summary

Chris Copeland and Mitch McGhee will give a summary of the current LED market place. They will take a brief look at how the market has evolved over the last several years then spend most of the discussion on the current wattage reductions possible, and the cost and performance of new LED lights, current replacement options and projected life span for Indoor and Outdoor lighting as well as current “new construction” options for LED lighting. We will then discuss where the LED market is heading in the future. There will be several samples of retrofit and new fixture LED options available for everyone to look at and test the light output.

In 2001 he received his Doctorate of Educational Leadership from the University of Georgia. His dissertation title is “A Principal’s Role in Opening a New School”, which is a study of the planning, funding, budgeting and construction of a new school from a school administrator’s point of view.
